

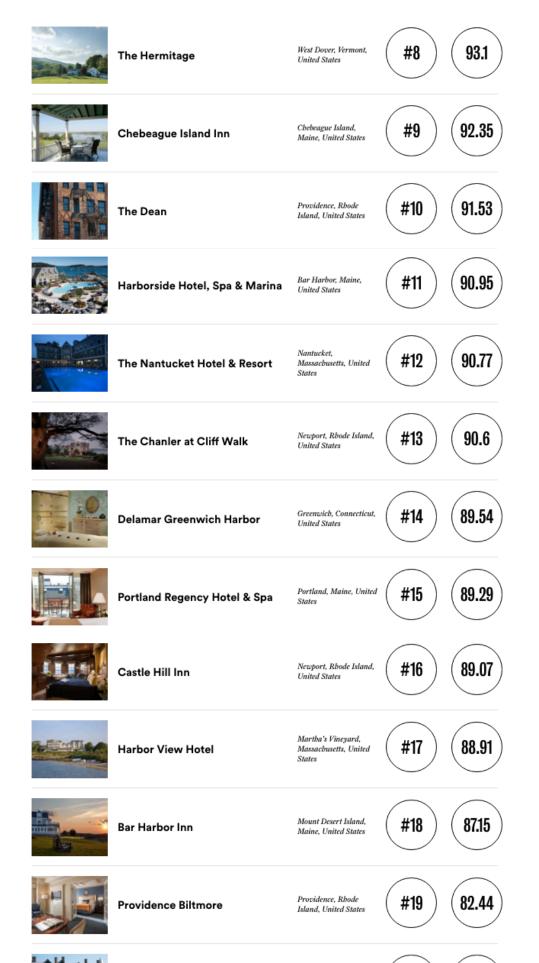

Each room is custom decorated—we like the two-suite Lodge for its tulip-post bed and an American Zodiak hand-hooked rug—and gourmet meals are customized to your palate. This beloved Vermont hotel is something of an institution—to those in the know, of course. Take advantage of the hotel's onsite tour guide, who can lead you through the surrounding woods on a nature walk, and the champagne-and-caviar hour that precedes dinner.
